

2010 WEST LAFAYETTE LITTLE LEAGUE (WLLL) INFORMATION AND REGISTRATION

General Information

1. The annual meeting of the West Lafayette Little League is Sunday, February 28 at 7:00 PM in the WLLL Complex on Benton St. This is a public meeting, and we encourage all interested people to attend and provide input to the WLLL program.

3. If you are planning to volunteer (manager, coach, team parent, umpire etc.) please bring to our player registration session the completed Little League Volunteer Application along with a copy of your driver's license or state identification card. Player Registration at West Lafayette Little League Complex: Friday, February 26, from 5 - 8 PM and Saturday, February 27, from 9 - 11 AM

Please follow these steps:

- Fill out the information on the attached form, indicating for which program you are registering your child;
- Bring the signed and completed form, a birth certificate copy and the registration fee to one of the registration sessions. Additional forms are available at your school, the WL Parks & Rec office, or at www.westlafayettelittleleague.org.
- **Age eligibility rules have been changed by the national Little League organization**
 - **Girls (Major and Minor leagues)** – age on December 31, **2009** is the age to use for Little League registration
 - **Boys (Bank and Business leagues)** – age on April 30, **2010** is the age to use for Little League registration
 - **Tee Ball** – age for boys and girls will be their age on April 30, **2010**
 - **Junior Softball and Junior Baseball** - age on April 30, **2010** is the age to use for Little League registration
- Scholarships are available based on need. There is a \$10 late fee assessed for those registering after March 31. Registration will be open longer for Jr. Softball and Tee Ball.

West Lafayette Little League is available for children who live in the West Lafayette postal area (47906). The programs begin in late March/ with skill clinics and Team Selection Day on April 10th. Coaches hold practices and schedule practice games from then until the season officially starts May 3rd. A six-week season is followed by a tournament, all of which finishes (weather permitting) by June 25th. All-Star teams are selected and compete in July and are eligible to advance to the Little League World Series in August.

BASEBALL -- Ages 9 – 12 Two competitive baseball leagues are available. The BUSINESS LEAGUE is organized for younger or less skilled players of ages 9-12. A pitching machine is used as opposed to “live-arm” pitching. Games are scheduled at 5:30 p.m. The BANK LEAGUE is composed of players ages 11-12, who possess greater skills. SOFTBALL -- Ages 9 – 12 Two competitive softball leagues are available for girls, ages 9-12, based upon age. Girls 9 and 10 years of age play in the Minor League, with games beginning at 5:30 p.m. 11 and 12 year-old girls play in the Major League and their games begin at 7:30 p.m. **Questions about Softball registration?** Call Tim Bobillo at 743-2820 bobillo@purdue.edu or Laura Bittner at 497-4351 laura.bittner2@verizon.net. *Depending upon the number of girls registering for the various age levels, 8 year-old girls may be eligible for Minor League Softball this season. JUNIOR SOFTBALL and BASEBALL -- Ages 7 to 8

The intent of the junior program is to offer athletes, ages 7 to 8, the chance to learn the skills, positions, and rules of baseball in competitive team play. Teams will play two games per week. ***Rule changed in 2006 and continues in 2010***– safety baseballs are used as they better fit smaller hands for learning fundamentals and they are softer and safer to use. **Questions about Junior registration?** Call Randy Truitt at 463-1737 randy@randytruitt.com.

CLINIC SESSIONS

All players (including existing Bank League players) wishing to play in competitive programs are expected to participate in their respective clinics and skills evaluation sessions for their age group. Players will be asked to run, throw, field grounders and flies, and bat. This enables coaches to get an idea of a player's skill level so that teams may be selected that are as evenly balanced as possible. Team managers will be present to assess players' skill levels. The purpose of these sessions is to make it possible for coaches to get to know the players and to help the players develop basic skills. These sessions will be held:

UNIFORMS AND EQUIPMENT FOR SOFTBALL AND BASEBALL PARTICIPANTS

Each child will receive a hat and a uniform shirt which is her/his to keep and wear anytime. Children playing in the competitive programs will also receive stirrup socks. **White baseball-style pants must be worn, but the league will not provide the pants.** Each player must provide fielder's gloves. Catcher's equipment will be provided by WLLL, but catchers MUST provide their own extra protection; by Little League rule, protective cups are required equipment for all catchers. Participants must wear sneakers or rubber cleats - - - METAL CLEATS ARE NOT ALLOWED. All bats must have the Little League Approved logo if they are to be used in any of our leagues.

New in 2006 and continues in 2010 – all players will be required to wear league-provided batting helmets with attached face mask!

INSURANCE

Registration fees allow us to obtain secondary insurance for participants. Claims resulting from any injuries incurred at any scheduled game or practice must first be submitted to the parent's insurance company. Claims for coverage in excess of the parent's policy should be submitted to Little League insurance through the League President.

FIELD DAY

One day is set aside for getting fields ready for the season. **Field Day is scheduled for Saturday, April 24** beginning at 8:30 a.m. **Every player and parent is expected to come and help out for at least an hour.** (Weather date is 05/01/10)

One final note: We are very proud of the Little League program that this community has enjoyed for many years. It is a program which emphasizes growth and development for our children in a positive and healthy way. Making this program work requires the involvement of ALL parents. Whether you serve as a manager, coach, team parent, or umpire, your involvement is welcome and necessary. Your participation in Field Day makes the task of getting the fields ready for play less of a burden for everyone.

Please remember that having children in Little League requires more than just dropping them off and picking them up.
